Dear Scholarship Applicant,

Thank you for your interest in Delegate Charlotte Crutchfield's 2021 Academic Scholarship. All applicants **MUST** be U.S. citizens or permanent residency card holders and residents of Maryland's Legislative District 19 in order to apply. To confirm that you are a Legislative District 19 resident, please visit <http://www.mdelect.net> and enter your address to confirm that you meet the residency requirement.

As part of the requirements for consideration for the scholarship, each applicant must provide a letter of interest addressed to Delegate Charlotte Crutchfield which addresses why you believe you should be awarded a Delegate scholarship. Your letter should include the name of the college or school you will attend for the 2021-2022 academic school year, your desired major, any community service work you have performed, your future career and academic goals and aspirations, and how this scholarship will assist you in achieving your desired goals. The letter **MUST** not exceed two (2) double-spaced pages in 12pt. Times Roman font. **All applicants also MUST file the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) by March 1, 2021.**

Please return the enclosed completed application with your letter of interest **NO LATER THAN April 30, 2021 by mail (6 Bladen Street, Room 226 Annapolis, MD 21401) or email (Charlotte.Crutchfield@house.state.md.us)**. In addition to the application and the letter, please send a copy of your most recent transcript or report card and a copy of the Student Aid Report (SAR) from your completed 2020 FAFSA (**please DO NOT send the entire document – only the SAR**). You may return the application via email or postal mail. **When returning the application via email, please be certain to save the file under your first and last name (i.e., lastname_firstname_2021).**

The Delegate Scholarship may be used for community college, undergraduate or graduate students. Both full and part-time students are eligible to apply. Full-time undergraduate students must maintain 12 credits or more per semester, while part-time undergraduate students must maintain 6-11 credits. Full-time graduate students must maintain 9 or more credits per semester, while part-time graduate students must maintain 6-8 credits per semester.
